There are forces that impinge on the ability to develop a successful independent practice. These include lack of training in the business of practice, cognitive distortions on the part of clinicians on how a practice "has to be," and a lack of recognition of possible practice opportunities that utilize the doctoral-level clinician's entire skill set. This workshop will focus on the process of creativity, and how entrepreneurial thinking can shape a thriving private practice. Numerous examples will be presented on how mental health professionals may consider expanding their current practice patterns beyond providing traditional psychotherapy services in their offices.

ABOUT THE PRESENTER

Steven Walfish, Ph.D. is in private practice in Atlanta, GA, and is a founding partner at The Practice Institute, LLC and a clinical professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the Emory University's School of Medicine. He has previously been in clinical practice in Tampa, Florida and Edmonds/Everett, Washington. He is the editor of Earning a Living Outside of Managed Care: Fifty Ways to Expand Your Practice, co-Editor of Translating Psychological Research into Practice, co-author of Financial Success in Mental Health Practice: Practical Strategies and Ethical Practice and Billing and Collecting for Your Mental Health Practice: Effective Strategies and Ethical Practice and co-author of The Ethics of Private Practice: A Practical Guide for Mental Health Clinicians. He has published more than 60 papers in peer-reviewed journals primarily in the areas of substance abuse, professional training and practice, weight loss surgery and crisis intervention. He has served on several editorial boards of journals and was the editor of *The Independent Practitioner*, the newsletter for APA Division 42 (Psychologists in Independent Practice). He is the inaugural editor of Practice Innovations, a Division 42 journal that will be published by APA beginning in 2016. In 2012, Dr. Walfish served as President of APA Division 42 (Psychologists in Independent Practice). He is a Fellow of APA, and in 2014 was elected as a Distinguished Practitioner of Psychology by the National Academies of Practice.
