The Reynolds Intellectual Assessment Scales (RIAS), published in 2003, and the Behavior Rating Inventory of Executive Function (BRIEF), published in 2000, have become staples in the intellectual and executive function assessment arsenal of many psychologists. This workshop describes the newest editions of the RIAS and the BRIEF, the RIAS-2 and BRIEF-2, by providing key information on practitioner- and research-driven changes to the new addition as well as its overall development, applications, and interpretation. This workshop will also introduce the Feifer Assessment of Reading (FAR) battery, a comprehensive and innovative new reading test designed to examine the underlying cognitive and linguistic processes that supports proficient reading skills. Attendees will be introduced to the four subtypes of reading disabilities from a brain-behavioral perspective, learn the details of the structure and subtests of the FAR that align with this perspective, and understand how assessment of the four subtypes leads to effective reading intervention.
