Candidates who do not hold an active and valid professional teaching certificate will be required to complete additional coursework or submit documentation as required by the state. At this time, the College of Psychology cannot confirm whether its Master of Science in Counseling degree with a Concentration in School Counseling meets all of the educational, licensure, and certification requirements in other states and territories outside of Florida. Further, these requirements can change frequently and often without notice.
