About 40% of the population experiences difficulty falling or staying asleep at some time in a given year, while 10% of people suffer chronic insomnia. This workshop provides practical and up-to-date advice on current approaches to assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of insomnia. Attendees will learn to correctly identify and diagnose insomnia and gain hands-on information on how to carry out treatment with the best evidence base: cognitive behavioral therapy for insomnia (CBT-I). The American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) and the American College of Physicians (ACP) both recognize CBT-I as the first-line treatment approach to insomnia.

ABOUT THE PRESENTERS

William K. Wohlgemuth, Ph.D. graduated from the University of Miami with a degree in Clinical Health Psychology. Following his internship, he completed postdoctoral training at Duke University Medical Center in the behavioral sleep medicine clinic. During that time, he was involved with several clinical trials investigating the efficacy of CBT-I. Since 2005, Dr. Wohlgemuth has been the director of the behavioral sleep medicine clinic at the Bruce W. Carter VA Medical Center in Miami. He is actively involved in training psychology practicum students and interns. Dr. Wohlgemuth is certified in behavioral sleep medicine by the American Academy of Sleep Medicine.

Ana Imia Fins, Ph.D. received her doctorate in Clinical Health Psychology from the University of Miami. She completed predoctoral and postdoctoral training in behavioral sleep medicine at the Durham, NC, Veterans Affairs Medical Center and at the Duke University Sleep Disorders Center. Currently, she is a professor at the College of Psychology at Nova Southeastern University, where she also co-directs the insomnia clinic. For 20 years Dr. Fins has been training students in the application of behavioral sleep medicine intervention strategies for the treatment of insomnia and other sleep disturbances.

The presenters are co-authors of <u>Insomnia</u>, a book in the series "Advances in Psychotherapy - Evidence-Based Practice."

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Participants will be able to:

- Describe the symptoms of insomnia, its epidemiology and prevalence, as well as its economic impact
- Identify the course and prognosis of insomnia
- Explain the basic functioning of the sleep and circadian systems
- Distinguish among various theoretical models (behavioral, cognitive, physiological) of insomnia
- Describe the most up-to-date DSM-5 diagnostic criteria for insomnia and recognize important comorbidities and differential diagnoses
- Accurately utilize primary assessment methods for insomnia including clinical interview and sleep diaries as well as other appropriate instruments for the evaluation of symptoms and treatment outcome
- Describe the independent evidence-based approaches to insomnia treatment (e.g., psychoeducation, stimulus control, sleep restriction) and explain how these are effectively combined into a comprehensive cognitive behavioral therapy for insomnia (CBT-I)
