Evidence-based psychotherapy is finally exiting the era of "protocols for syndromes." Over its nearly 40-year history, Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT) has been focused more on processes of change and their underlying basic principle than on techniques, procedures, and protocols. In this brief introduction to ACT and its underlying "Psychological Flexibility Model." The presenter will show how that focus not only simplifies and empowers clinical work, but also opens the door to a more useful future for evidence-based psychological intervention.

ABOUT THE PRESENTER

Steven C. Hayes, Ph.D. is a Nevada Foundation Professor in the behavior analysis program at the department of psychology at the University of Nevada. An author of 46 books and nearly 650 scientific articles, he is the developer of Relational Frame Theory, an account of human higher cognition, and has guided its extension to Acceptance and Commitment Therapy or "ACT," a popular evidence-based form of psychotherapy that uses mindfulness, acceptance, and values-based methods and has been shown to be helpful in a wide range of areas. His popular book *Get Out of Your Mind and Into Your Life* was featured in *Time Magazine* among several other major media outlets and for a time was the best-selling self-help book in the United States, and his new book, *A Liberated Mind*, has been recently released to wide acclaim. Dr. Hayes has been President of several scientific societies and has received several national awards, such as the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Association for Behavioral and Cognitive Therapies. Google Scholar ranks him as among the most cited scholars in all areas of study in the world.
