

ADVANCED TOPICS IN MMPI-3 INTERPRETATION

This full-day workshop builds on the *Introduction to the MMPI-3* workshop with a focus on advanced topics in MMPI-3 interpretation. Attendees will learn about the literature available to support use of the MMPI-3 in a range of psychological assessment in a diversity-sensitive manner. The test co-author Yossef Ben-Porath, will cover diversity-sensitive use of the MMPI-3, advanced validity scale interpretation, use of the MMPI-3 in diagnostic and treatment planning assessments, and use of the MMPI-3 in specialized assessments including presurgical, preemployment, and forensic evaluations. Case studies will be used to illustrate MMPI-3 interpretation in these assessments.

He received his doctoral training at the University of Minnesota and has been involved extensively in MMPI research for the past 37 years. He is a co-developer of the MMPI-3, MMPI-2-RF, and MMPI-A-RF and co-author of test manuals, books, book chapters, and articles on the MMPI instruments. Former Editor-in-Chief of the journals *Assessment* and *Psychological Assessment*, Dr. Ben-Porath is a board-certified psychologist (American Board of Professional Psychology-Clinical) whose clinical practice involves supervision of assessments at Kent State's Psychological Clinic, consultation to agencies that screen candidates for public safety positions, and provision of consultation and expert witness services in forensic cases.
