GUIDING TRAUMATIZED CLIENTS TO FIND SOLID GROUND

Until recently, there was little treatment research to guide clinicians about how to stabilize the most severely dissociative and traumatized clients. Few mental health clinicians have received systematic training about the assessment and treatment of dissociation. It is critical that clinicians are aware of the myths as well as the research about treating complex dissociative clients. Dr. Brand will discuss myths about treating dissociative individuals and findings from the Treatment of Patients with Dissociative Disorders (TOP DD) studies. This series of studies show a wide range of improvements for patients receiving present-oriented, stabilizing treatment. More than a decade of research and input from clinicians and individuals living with dissociative reactions informed the development of the psychoeducational program called Finding Solid Ground. Dr. Brand will provide an overview of the randomized controlled trial that assesses the impact of the Finding Solid Ground program. Patients who participated in the study showed a wide range of benefits including decreased posttraumatic stress symptoms, enhanced self-compassion, and improved emotion regulation and adaptive participated functioning. Clinicians who in the study deepened their understanding of practical approaches to help stabilize complex trauma clients.

ABOUT THE PRESENTER

Bethany Brand, Ph.D. is an Emerita Psychology Professor at Towson University. She has over 30 years of clinical and research experience, including training at Johns Hopkins Hospital, George Washington University Hospital, and at Sheppard Pratt Health System's Trauma Disorders program. Dr. Brand has published over 130 papers focusing on treatment of complex trauma and dissociation (i.e., the TOP DD studies); the assessment of trauma-related dissociation; critiques of the fantasy model of dissociation; training about trauma; and the accuracy of textbooks' coverage of trauma, among other topics. Dr. Brand has received numerous awards for teaching, research, and her contributions to the field of trauma. She is a co-author of Finding Solid Ground: Overcoming Obstacles in Trauma Treatment and The Finding Solid Ground Workbook and author of The Concise Guide to the Assessment and Treatment of Trauma-related Dissociation. In addition to treating patients, Dr. Brand serves as a forensic expert in trauma-related cases including death penalty and death row cases.
