



Forensic Psychology Faculty

The College of Psychology at Nova Southeastern University invites qualified applications for an open rank faculty position in clinical psychology. We are seeking an individual with teaching, clinical, and/or research expertise in Forensic Psychology.

The successful candidates are expected to have demonstrated excellence in teaching and mentoring of students. Administrative experience in an academic setting is required. Additionally, they must be actively involved in research and scholarship, with expectations to maintain an ongoing program of research, publish, and supervise student research. A track record of, or potential to secure external funding to support research is desirable. Individuals with demonstrated commitment to diversity through their teaching, scholarship, and/or service are encouraged to apply.

The teaching expectation for the position includes core psychology courses. Additionally, the faculty will serve as the director of the Master's program in forensic psychology. The administrative duties include: 1) Managing student and adjunct faculty academic issues; 2) Class scheduling and instructor assignment to classes; 3) Monitoring recruitment, admissions, and retention of students; 4) Overseeing student academic services for the program; 5) Hiring and supporting adjunct faculty; and 5) Maintaining a student learning outcome database to facilitate completion of administrative reports. The faculty member is also expected to fulfill service responsibilities to the department, college, and university.

- Doctorate degree in psychology
- Licensed or license-eligible as a psychologist in the state of Florida
- College and/or university level teaching experience
- A record of scholarly publications
- Clinical/scholarly expertise in forensic psychology
- Administrative experience in an academic setting

Desired Qualifications

- Experience with on-line course management
- Experience in teaching graduate level courses
- Potential to secure external funding to support a research program
