ABOUT THE PRESENTER

Camellia Westwell, Psy.D., ABPP is a Board-Certified Clinical Psychologist who earned her Doctor of Psychology from Nova Southeastern University in 2000. She holds a master's degree in counseling psychology from Rollins College and a bachelor's degree in Psychology from Florida Technical College. She completed a one-year post-doctoral fellowship in behavioral medicine at Jackson Memorial Medical Center and directed programs in South Florida in the Dependency Court System with the Department of Children and Families (DCF) and the Guardian Ad Litem Program. Over the years, she has provided clinical services in a variety of settings including inpatient hospitals, outpatient facilities, schools, corrections facilities, and the Kennedy Space Center. More recently, she participated in a COVID Recovery Response Team for staff members at Tampa General Hospital.

Dr. Westwell has worked with the Veterans Health Administration since 2004. She currently serves as a full-time staff psychologist for the Orlando VA Healthcare System where she provides specialized assessment and treatment services to veterans and serves on several national workgroups. Her areas of interest include combat stress, sexual trauma, and depression. She provides Prolonged Exposure Treatment, Eye Movement Desensitization Re-Processing Treatment, Dialectical Behavior Therapy, and Interpersonal Psychotherapy. She is also a VA National Consultant for Interpersonal Psychotherapy for Depression. She is regularly involved in leading trainings and supervision of staff, interns, and residents within the VA system. Dr Westwell is also an adjunct faculty member at Nova Southeastern University, a facilitator for the Red Cross (Service to the Armed Forces Division) and an examiner for the American Board of Professional Psychology (ABPP).

In appreciation of the importance of the profession of psychology, Dr. Westwell is a member of the American Psychological Association (APA) and an active member of the Florida Psychological Association (FPA) where she has served on the executive, state, and county boards of the association. Throughout her career, she has been the proud recipient of various awards working tirelessly for the field of psychology.
