Internship Program Admissions

The NSU Psychology Services Center (PSC) internship program is an APA accredited training program. The Psychology Services Center provides services on a sliding scale fee for service basis to the diverse South Florida community. We provide training in assessment and psychotherapy with children, adolescents, and adults with a wide range of presenting problems in a culturally competent manner. Interns spend 25% of their time working within the Children, Adolescents and Families (CAFS) program and 25% within the Adult Services Program (ASP). The other half of the interns' time is spent in one of four programs, to which the intern matches: Trauma Resolution Integration Program (TRIP), Child & Adolescent Traumatic Stress Program (CATSP), NSU Counseling Center for Older Adults (NCCOA) or School-related Psychological Assessments and Clinical Interventions (SPACI). In addition, interns supervise practicum students under the supervision of a licensed psychologist, teach a pre-practicum course for first-year psychology doctoral students during the Winter semester, and attend weekly didactic activities to round out their generalist training.
