## NCMHCE Pass Rates

---

The Florida Board of Clinical Social Work, Marriage & Family Therapy and Mental Health Counseling serves as the licensing board for mental health counselors. A passing score on the National Clinical Mental Health Counseling Examination (NCMHCE) is required for licensure. The following table displays the pass rates of NSU alumni on the NCMHCE and the average pass rate in Florida:

## NCE Pass Rates

The National Board of Certified Counselors (NBCC) serves as the national certification board for professional counselors. A passing score on the National Counselors Examination (NCE) is required for certification as a National Certified Counselor (NCC). The following table describes NSU students' results and pass rates on the NCE taken Fall 2022 and Spring 2023:

## Program Completion Rate

---

Students are admitted into graduate study and must meet matriculation requirements to become a degree candidate in the M.S. in Counseling program. Of the students who were admitted into the M.S. program in Mental Health Counseling in 2017, 68.33% were retained through graduation. Of the students who were matriculated into the program (84.55%), 80.82% were retained through graduation.

## **Job Placement Rates**

---

Alumni from the M.S. in Counseling, Clinical Mental Health Counseling concentration were surveyed concerning job placement. Forty out of 324 survey recipients responded as follows:
