<p><u>PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE DISCLOSURE STATEMENT</u></p> <p>This Disclosure is strictly limited to NSU’s determination of whether the <b>MS in Counseling, Applied Behavior Analysis Concentration</b> (the “Program”), if successfully completed, would be sufficient to meet the educational requirements for licensure or certification in a State, as defined as 34 C.F.R. § 600.2.</p> <p>Nova Southeastern University, College of Psychology, Master of Science in Counseling, Applied Behavior Analysis Concentration has been verified by The Association of Behavior Analysis International (ABAI) as meeting the coursework requirements for eligibility to take the Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) examination.</p> <p>Certification as a BCBA is necessary in order to practice Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) independently in the United States. The curriculum meets educational requirements to apply for national certification as a BCBA.</p> <p>Some states require licensure in addition to certification. Professional licensure is not currently required in the following states: Arkansas, California, Colorado, Delaware, Florida, Idaho, Maine, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Mexico, South Carolina, and West Virginia.</p> <p><b>NOTE: This Disclosure does not provide any guarantee that any particular State licensure entity will approve or deny your application for certification or professional licensure.</b> Furthermore, this Disclosure does not account for changes in state law or regulations that may affect your application for certification or licensure or occur after this disclosure has been made.
