<b>Professional Licensure Disclosure Statement:</b>  <p>Nova Southeastern University, College of Psychology, Master of Science in Counseling, Clinical Mental Health Counseling Concentration meets the educational degree completion requirements for licensure in the state of Florida as a Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC), and certification requirements for the National Certified Counselor (NCC) credential from the National Board for Certified Counselors. The Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP), a specialized accrediting body recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA), has granted an 8-year accreditation to the M.S. in Counseling, Clinical Mental Health Counseling (CMHC) concentration at Nova Southeastern University.</p> <p>Students seeking licensure outside of Florida should understand the requirements of the state/country in which they will pursue licensure and determine if any restrictions exist before enrolling in the M.S. in Counseling academic program. It is also recommended that students who seek licensure in Florida understand the differences if they should relocate.</p> <p>Several states have unique licensing requirements, and thus this information is subject to change without notice. Please note that placements cannot be made in the state of New York or outside of the United States or its Territories.</p> <p>Students seeking licensure in California and Ohio may be required to complete an additional course per those state's specific statutes. We advise you to contact your state licensing and certification body to ensure the degree will meet requirements for licensure in the state in which you seek to be licensed.
