School counselors provide academic, social, and career support to promote student success in school. School counselors frequently collaborate with others and provide consultation and coordination of school counseling programs. They also work at the classroom level with small groups and individuals. While school counselors do not provide long-term therapy, they focus on brief interventions and directing more chronic and severe issues to the appropriate care

provider." - Dr. Eric Thompson
