"I was able to have telehealth sessions with clients at my internship site while under quarantine for COVID-19. In that time, I was able to do individual and group therapy sessions as well as performing intake interviews. It also made me learn a different kind of patience because my clients were frustrated with the situation and with the medium we were using for the therapeutic session.
